October 19, 2023

Start Time: 6:30 p.m.

The **Sunshine Statement** was read into the record by Mayor Ritter.

The **Flag Salute** was led by Mayor Ritter.

Roll Call: Mayor Paul Ritter, Vice Mayor Robin Freitag, Tom Tedesco, David Miller and Kelsey Bayzick present.

Also Present: John Hitchner, Admin; Jeannette Pace, Acting Clerk; Township Solicitor Matt Ritter, Esquire

PRESENTATIONS:

New Jersey State Police:

Sgt. Steve Swift of the New Jersey State Police attended the meeting. Sgt. Swift provided the Committee with his background and provided updates on various issues happening throughout the township.

Blauer Associates:

Mark Blauer of Blauer Associates appeared for a Performance Hearing. The Performance Hearing was duly advertised in the South Jersey Times and Proof of Publication is on file with the Clerk.

Blauer discussed the Home Rehabilitation Program and the Convenience Center Project. A Motion to Open to the Public was made by Bayzick and seconded by Freitag with a voice vote all in favor.

Bruce Hankins asked if the Convenience Center project was fully funded and what the age restrictions were going to be. The Committee discussed the age for "senior citizen" and came up with several reasons why it should be one age or another but the end result was that we would consider the age of 55 for this purpose since that is the age used at our Senior Center.

Gary Van Meter questioned the different lanes. Hitchner indicated that residents would receive different colored placards for the specific lanes and the benefit of using the ADA compliant lane would be staff assistance to the residents.

Jeff Shimp asked about any grants for recreation, e.g. for the little league. Blauer advised that grants are specific for ADA deficiencies and that privately owned facilities have extreme difficulty getting grants. He suggested checking into local recreation improvement grants.

A Motion to Close the Public Portion was made by Freitag and seconded by Bayzick with a voice vote all in favor.

Approval of Minutes

Approval of the September 21, 2023, Regular Meeting Minutes Motion to approve by Miller; Seconded by Bayzick. Voice Vote: All in favor.

Approval of Department Reports

Motion to approve by Miller; Seconded by Freitag. Voice Vote: All in favor.

• Treasurer's Report and Approval of Bills

Discussion: There is a discrepancy in one of the bills to H.H. Hankins which will be reviewed. With that, a Motion to approve was made by Freitag; Seconded Miller. Voice Vote: All in favor.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Motion to Open to Public by Bayzick; Seconded by Freitag. Voice Vote: All in favor.

Doug Zirkle talked about the procedures needed to support the drone usage at the fire department. He spoke of separate incidences where the drone has assisted.

David Wilson attended the meeting to discuss the purchase of the paper street on Osborn Lane adjoining his property. The committee discussed the purchase and Solicitor Ritter advised that he would have to do further research into the issue due to the additional adjoining neighbors.

PRESENTATION #2:

Mark Blauer was also in attendance to discuss the 2024 Funding Round. This was also published in the South Jersey Times with Proof of Publication on file with the Clerk. Blauer advised that the Township was out of funds for any additional rehabs this year and discussed the procedure to apply for additional funds for 2024. He also discussed applying for additional grants for other ADA compliant projects. Hitchner asked if the ADA grants could be used for several smaller projects instead of one big one? Blauer answered in the affirmative.

A Motion to Open the Public Portion was made by Bayzick and seconded by Freitag with a voice vote all in favor.

Seeing no one, a Motion to Close was made by Tedesco and seconded by Miller with a voice vote all in favor.

Moved upon the agenda, Sewer Budget Discussion:

Ed Johnson, Director of Public Works, appeared and addressed the Committee. Johnson gave an update on the status of the condition of the Public Works' vehicles. He discussed the sewer stations as well as the pump station issues. He updated the Committee on the compressor issues at Holly Terrace and updated them on the current procedures being followed at the Convenience Center.
